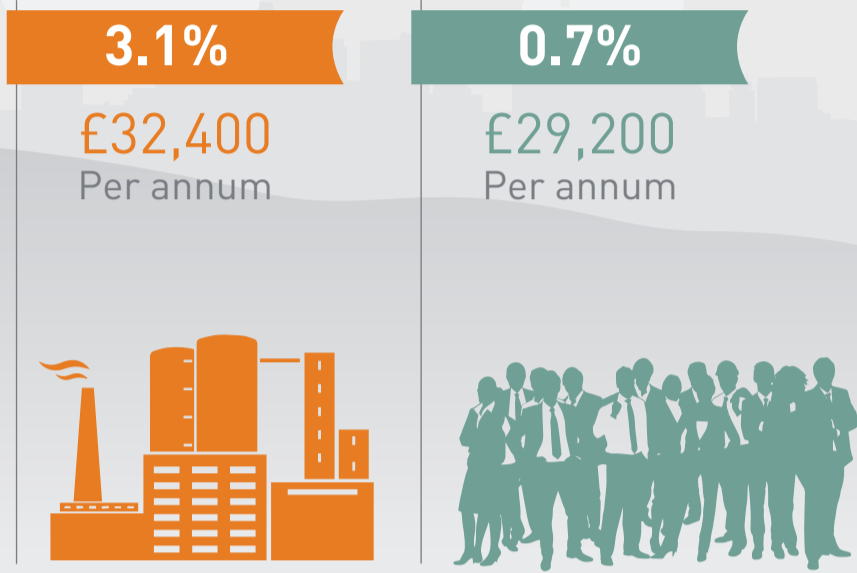

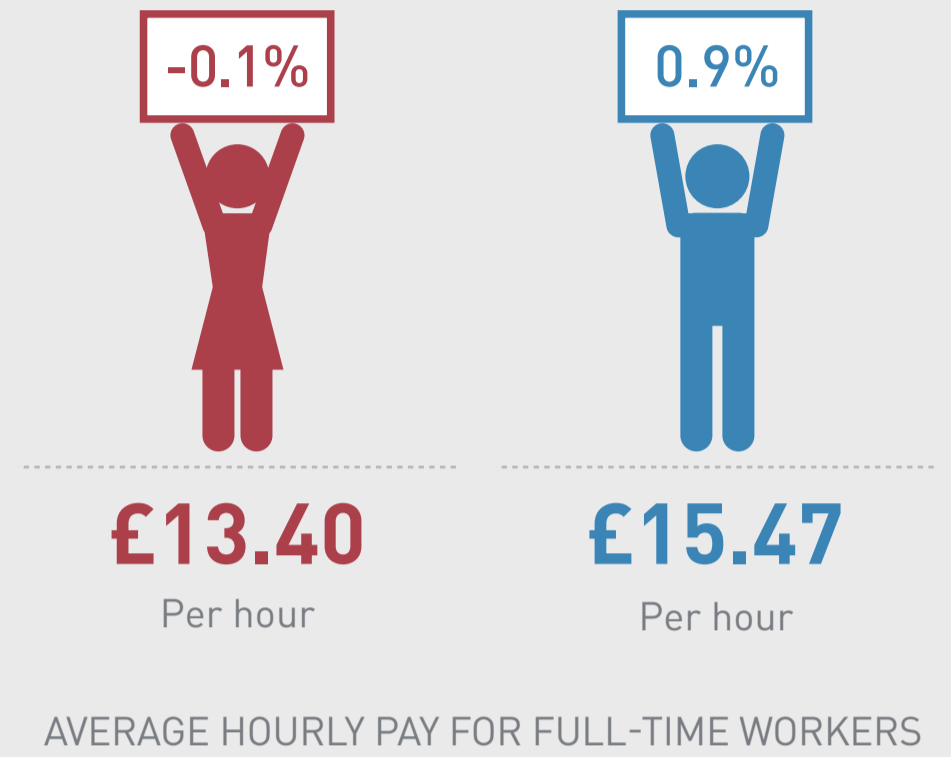

PAY LEAGUE 2015: GENDER PAY DIVIDE

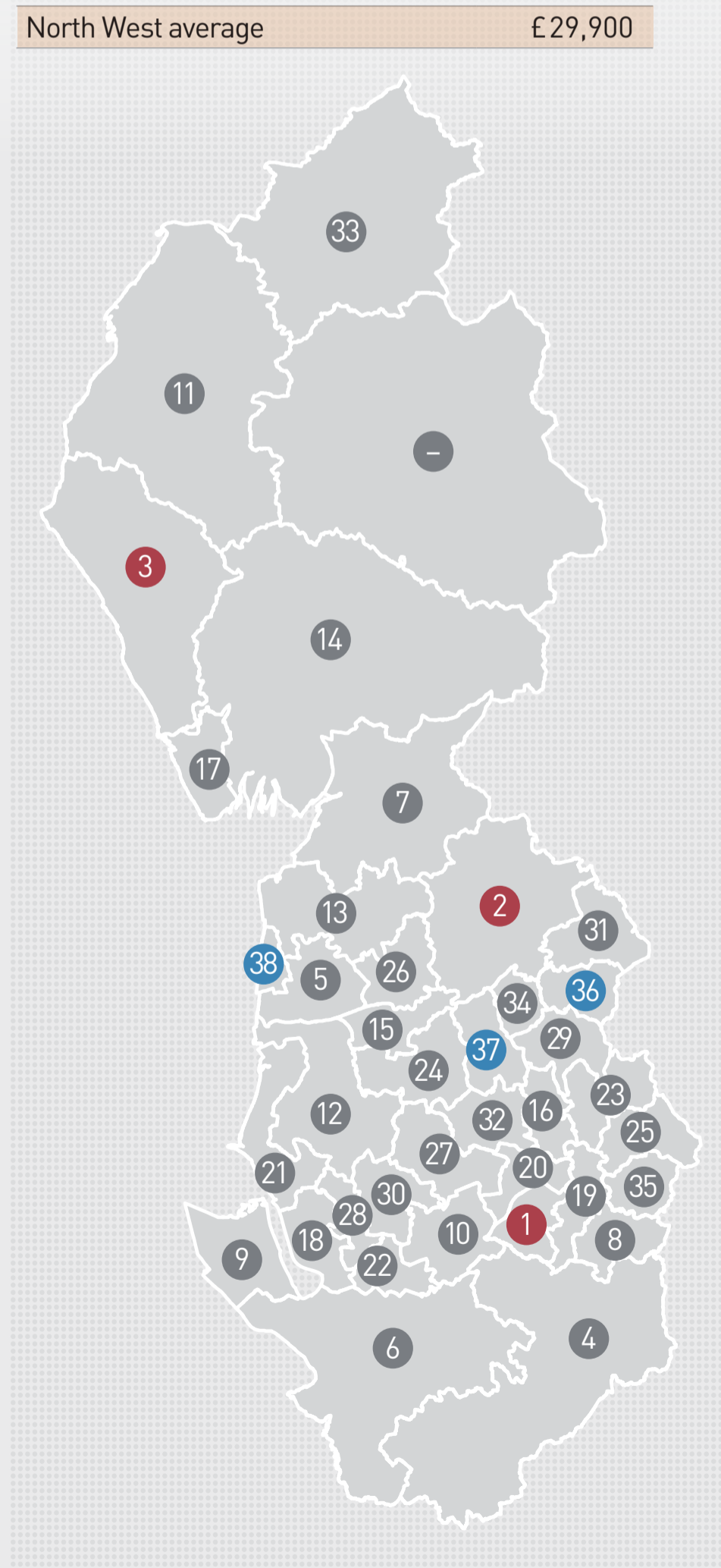
