

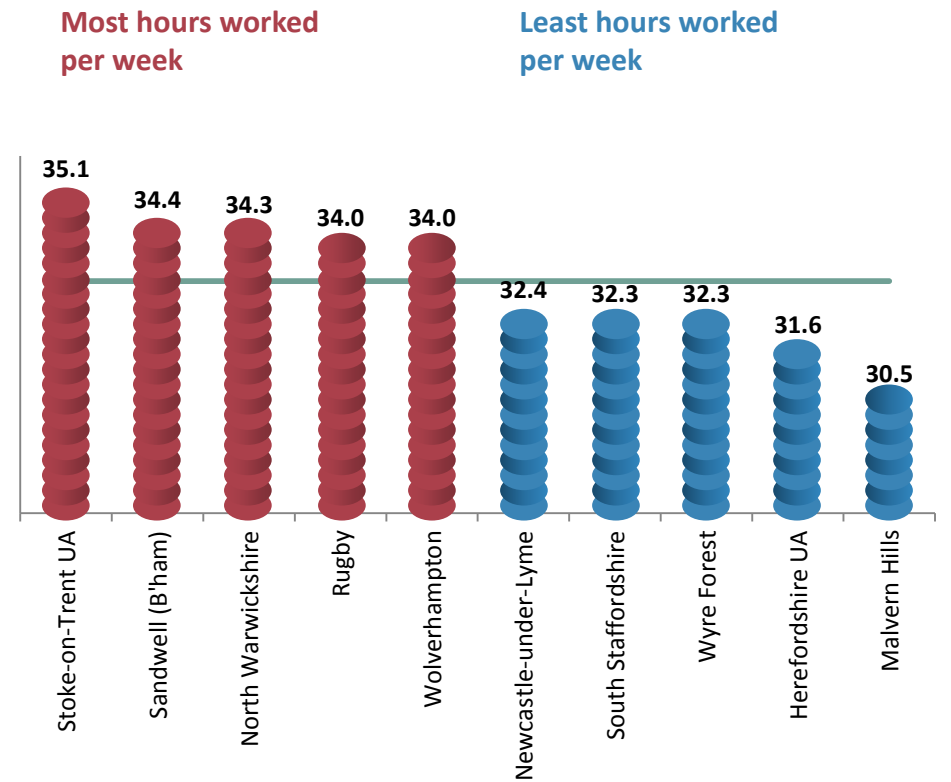


Key findings

(Average paid hours worked per week)



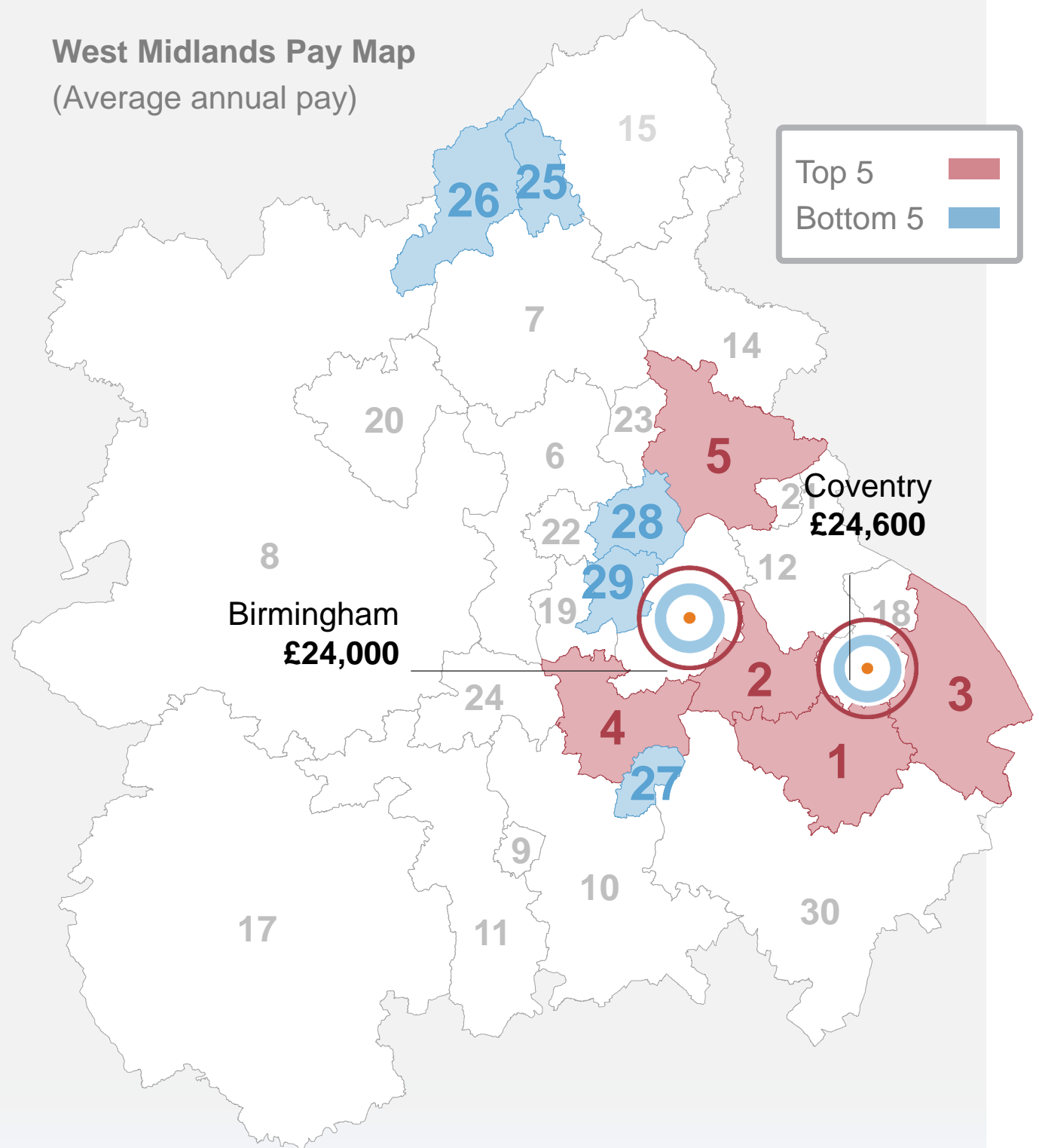
Pay by gender (Average hourly pay)
