


Hiring plans slow in North West amid talent shortage

Employers in the North West are cautious about hiring in the quarter ahead. The region's Outlook of +3% is below the UK average with concerns over Brexit and a candidate shortage putting employers off from planning more hires.

MARKET OVERVIEW
