

Weak Hiring Pace Forecast for West Midlands

The struggling labour market is forecast to continue in the next three months with employers reporting a Net Employment Outlook of -6%. Hiring intentions improve by four percentage points in comparison with the prior quarter, but decline by 17 percentage points when compared with this time one year ago.

MARKET OVERVIEW

Employers in the West Midlands are signaling a slow labour market, with 37% expecting pre-crisis hiring levels to resume within 12 months, and 18% expecting those levels to return within the next three months.

From a flexibility standpoint, 32% of employers indicate that they will offer more flexi or condensed hours as a result of the pandemic, 23% will offer staff the opportunity to work remotely some of the time, and 12% are planning to enable staff to work remotely all of the time – all below the national average for the respective offerings. More health and wellbeing perks will be provided by 17% of employers, and 29% will look to increase upskilling and development opportunities for their staff.
